Scripture Reflection

One real distinctive feature of the Christian religion is the Church's belief that God, although one, is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This belief was hammered out in the early centuries of the Church's life.

It all goes to show us that God is about relationship, not only within the "Godhead" but also in regard to us. God established a relationship with the created world and all of its inhabitants, inviting them to enter into the flow of love that exists within Him.

Unfortunately we know all too well that people don't plug into the "flow". Some of us might remember how shocked we were years ago (in the sixties) when a young woman was attacked on the street in the Bronx in daylight and no one came to her aid. Fast forward sixty some years and think of the reports that we are often hearing now: college student becomes intoxicated and very sick at a college party, becomes un-conscious, and his frat brothers leave him to go and google his symptoms on-line rather than get him help right away. He dies. Many other examples could be given, but we don't want Scripture reflection to become a downer.

We take comfort that many respond to the needs of others, we have many examples that we're acquainted with at our parish, and most recently, a group called Ananias that tries to raise funds for resettlement of Syrian refugees.

Let us take time to remember that if we are part of God's love, we must "relate" to others, especially to those in need, as we become aware of them. It's all about being like God. "Religion" is not about me, myself, and I. It is about me, others, and God and if the doctrine of the Trinity teaches us anything, it is that God and life are about relationships!
