Scripture Reflection

CONTINUING THE SERMON ON THE MOUNT.....

Jesus continues to challenge us to live God's way, and in this Sunday's gospel, it is about being peacemakers, imitating our Heavenly Father who is loving and non-violent. He is telling us not to play the game of scapegoating others or playing the victim or projecting our inner hatred onto others.

Whereas in "olden" days (really?) it was said, someone does something to you, you do it back, you retaliate, (Eye for eye, tooth for tooth), Jesus says to get out of that world of bondage, slavery, and do something new that frees you up to be transformed by God's grace. Turn the other cheek, give him your clothes, go two miles, create a new system of "rules", blow the old system apart! You take the initiative and change the expectations and outcome! If someone wants something from you, give him double of what he asks!

In "olden" days, it was said to love your neighbor and hate your enemy. If you love and greet only those who love you, who are part of your "group" you remain in bondage to your small world of "warm fuzzies" You're like a robot or an animal, you only respond to your own kind, you can't move beyond, you can't really love. If you can't loaf with Cleveland fans, you can't move beyond your in group of Steeler fans, and then it is easy to wind up scapegoating Cleveland (or Baltimore) for everything that is bad about the Steelers.

Unless there is love of enemies, there is no real transformation of the self, because the enemy always carries the dark side of your own soul. Normally those people who threaten us carry our own faults in a different form. The people who turn you off are very much like you. You have to love your enemy to grow up! (Also, what we don't like about ourselves is our inner enemy, and we must learn to love and forgive that enemy).

If we only greet our friends and people like ourselves, what is so great about that? If we are confined to our own group, we should be able to see how easily it is to slip into hatred for others or disdain for others, like refugees who are running for their lives. The key is always to love the stranger at the gate, whether it is that child of yours on drugs, or that displaced person from another country. Until you can enter into the outsider, and the other, Jesus says, you have not loved at all. Why? The Father's love is all encompassing.

God lets the sun and rain fall upon the good and the bad. Who then are we to withhold love from someone that we don't like? Eventually, God rubs off on people who hang around him.

And if it isn't what does that say about who we hang around with? That's why Jesus says to become perfect as our heavenly Father is perfect, which doesn't mean to be obsessive-compulsive about every area of life, but to let one's love not know any limits. To say that God is perfect is to say that God is all loving,
