Scripture Reflection

Love One Another....

So, why this command? Of all the things Jesus might have asked of us, why the command to love each other? Why not command us to go to church, or tithe our income, or wear a cross necklace, or put a Christian bumper sticker on our cars? Perhaps because Jesus knew all of these external signs, as important as they are, could be easily faked, or substituted for the real obedience and the transformed life of the Christians he knew we must become if Christianity was to spread through the world across human history. The world can easily dismiss our practices of faith or our statements of belief and doctrine. Those are important to us to be sure, but they will not be the signs of Jesus which will make the world stand up and take notice.

The mark of Jesus, the sign that we are not our own, but His, must run much deeper than simply wearing his jersey. The single most important witness to the world that we belong to Christ is the consistency and the clarity of our love for each other, both within and beyond the Christian Church. Just as Jesus predicted, when we love each other in ways that defy common logic and with generosity that is counter-intuitive, the world takes notice. When we love the unlovely, when we forgive the undeserving sinner when we go beyond our comfort zone to serve the downcast or powerless, when we care for and nurture the injured or the dying-these are the signs that a greater love is at work within us. And even the world knows that New Year's resolutions, or temporary sentimentality, cannot produce or sustain such love. It begs the question, "What is the source and the secret of this unusual and powerful love Christians display for each other, and for the world?"

And there is only one answer. It is not that we are more lovely, or more loving, by our own power. We are simply passing along the transforming love of God that comes so freely and lavishly to us through Christ. It is not our own, as indeed, we are not our own.

This is the attraction of Christian faith to the outside world. As music makes sense of dancing, it is the love of God unleashed among us that makes all of our practices of the Christian faith make sense. The call of the Church is not to teach the world to dance, but to help them hear the music.

With God's help and in joyous obedience to the command of Christ whose mark we gladly bear, let us so love each other that the world will say again with amazement, "My how they love each other!"
