**Scripture Reflection**


From the very beginning the first Christian communities were eager to gather together. Before Pentecost, the Risen Christ breathed the Spirit upon the discouraged disciples and transformed them into courageous preachers, confronting the leaders of their people. At each of his appearances, He sends the disciples to proclaim the good news of the Resurrection to the whole universe.

After Pentecost, the disciples met to continue the work of the Risen Lord by meeting, to teach, share goods as needed, break the bread and share the cup, and pray. This formed the first celebrations of the Eucharist, and the people realized that they were to BECOME the Body and Blood of the Lord by their participation in the weekly meetings. So began the Mass, the Eucharist, which one theologian has called “the only command of the Lord the Church has always fulfilled.”

As we continue to celebrate the Eucharist today, may we remember that we have been called to be transformed in to the Body and Blood of Christ, not just the bread and wine on the altar, all by the way, by action of the Holy Spirit. Praise God !

I was wondering about the appeal for our parish school. We are asked to give so much here at our parish. There is either a second collection or somebody at the door all the time. And by the way, what does the parish do with “all that money from the festival and fish fry?”

Dear Life-Long Parishioner,

Thank you for your letter. This will be an opportunity to try to explain some things.

First off, the Pastor wishes to thank the volunteer committee that comes forward to begin a fund drive for the school. Many other Catholic Schools have been doing the same thing for some time. There is no future for our schools unless there is sufficient funding.

In the Diocese of Pittsburgh. 60% of the cost of the school is to be covered by tuition, 30% by a subsidy from the parish, and 10% from fund-raising (merchant certificates, fashion show, Jamboree, just to name a few).

In the last several years, money from tuition and fundraising has not met budget projections. The parish has been increasing its monthly subsidy. Obviously this cannot continue and so the appeal was started. To date we have received \$4,360.00 and the school and Pastor are very appreciative of these gifts! The money will be placed in an interest bearing account and will be drawn upon to help cover tuition. The monies will be under the Father Peter A. Kuenzig Tuition Aid Fund.

As for “where does all that money go?” It goes to upkeep of the plant, such as re-sealing the parking lots, retrofitting our roofing system on the Pavilion, buying new equipment for the kitchen, such as refrigerators and freezers, up-grading the AC system in the church. This year we hope to replace the carpeting in the Gathering Place. So, in addition to our school, there are plenty of needs for money.

We should all be grateful for the school faculty and administration for accepting less than scheduled salary increases in the last several years. Also, our acting principal is working under her teacher’s salary to fill that position. Yet costs increase. Healthcare insurance goes up. This year we were notified that the employer contribution to the pension plan will increase \$3000.00 annually for each teacher. Those are simply two items.

For our school to survive and prosper, it needs students and money. We hope this letter helps explain the purpose of the appeal and we want to thank all for their kindness, attention, and understanding.
