Scripture Reflection

A wise parishioner recently said: “we’re in this recession because we all have too much stuff....well, “stuff” can suffocate, stuff can be possessions that are signs pointing to their owner who is cool, very cool. Designer sportswear comes to mind. Stuff, however, can also be seen as psychological baggage, which can be more dangerous than possessions. In any case, stuff can invade and take over a person’s life, soul and vision.

In today’s gospel, the stuff is the grain that the rich man can’t get enough of. He is so driven that he tears down his barns to build new ones to house the bumper crop. He had it made. So confident of his place in the world, he rested, ate, drank, and was merry. Bad choice. He chose stuff over life with God. He dies. His stuff did not help.

What about our stuff?

The history of any religion usually makes some attempt to regulate the stuff that believers manage or accumulate in the course of their life cycles. It is important though to define the stuff before one attempts to control it. The stuff could be visible, such as houses or clothing or automobiles. Or the stuff could be psychological debris, such as unresolved crises or continuous passive-aggressive behavior, which can torpedo any relationship.

It is a wise person who is able to name good stuff and walk away from the bad stuff. The judgment is made easier if one has continuously walked with God.

Today’s first reading from Ecclesiastes is a masterpiece on how to make these judgments. Vanity plays a large role in the decision-making process. It doesn’t have to be that complicated. It will all fall into place no matter how much stuff you have.
