Scripture Reflection

In the midst of the careful script for the Passover Meal, or perhaps at the end of that script, Jesus surprised his disciples by offering a variation from the centuries-old tradition. He took the bread and cup an extra time (the Seder already involves four times when the cup of wine is raised and shared), and with these immortal actions and words he set in motion an entirely new understanding of the story of God’s redemptive and saving hand in behalf of His people:

*He took the bread, blessed it, and said, “Take it, this is my body.”
Then he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said, “This is the blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many.”*

The disciples must have been stunned by this amendment to the ancient Passover tradition. And indeed, it would be much later before they would fully understand what Jesus was doing and saying that night. They had just witnessed the birth of the Eucharist. Surely they could not have realized at the time how sacred and solemn that feast of remembrance would become for them, and for the Church for all the ages to follow!

It was just a simple loaf of unleavened bread, and a cup of wine— ordinary items familiar to every Palestinian household—but from the hands of Jesus, as they were broken and blessed and given, those simple elements became infused with a mystery and presence of God. It was his own body and blood that Jesus offered as a sacrifice for us. We celebrate this incredible act of love every time we approach the table to receive the Eucharist. We come with our hands and mouths open, with our hearts and souls open. We come, not because we are worthy, but because we are not. We come to the table of the Lord, not because we have it all figured out, but because we are still full of questions and doubts. In short, we come to the Lord’s table in just the same way those first disciples came.

But this one thing we must do when we approach the Lord’s table. We must slow down. We must not come in a hurry. God does not serve fast food to solitary individuals at this table. He serves slow food to those seeking communion with Him, and with each other. And best of all, this unhurried feast served by our unhurried Host, does not lead to death, but to life eternal, to a table prepared in heaven for all those who practiced here on earth the sacred pace slowing down in front of the holy presence of God. How could we hurry past, or multi-task, at this feast?

Come with holy hush. Come with awe and humility. For this is the very body and blood of our Lord.
